Winter Hiking at Harvey Bear Ranch **Friday, January 23, 2009, 10:00 AM**

Celebrate the New Year with an invigorating hike at this county park near Gilroy. The landscape consists of rolling hills with oaks and buckeyes and lots of wild turkey, deer, squirrels, red-tailed hawks and turkey vultures. The park adjoins Coyote Lake. On the Ridge Trail we should have spectacular views of south Santa Clara County.

Our hike will take us on a fairly strenuous loop route of almost 6 miles. We'll begin at the parking lot (about 500 feet elevation) along the Harvey Bear and Willow Springs Trail, then on the Coyote Ridge trail where we will top out at about 1200 feet.
